Update on the 2022 Plan

- 4 sites decommissioned in 2022:
 - 195 Princes' Blvd
 - 1684 Queen St E
 - 45 The Esplanade
 - 30 Norfinch Dr
- 65 Dundas St E continues a phased transition to supportive and affordable housing that began in 2022 through 2023
- Ongoing work underway on lessons learned through this phase of transition

Extending lease/licensing agreements at COVID-19 temporary hotels

- At of Jan 1 2023, 23 temporary shelter sites are operating as part of the City's shelter system, making up approximately 3,000 individuals and 30% of the spaces in the City's shelter system.
- On April 6, 2022, City Council passed a motion to extend leases at existing shelter hotels provided that no such extension shall extend later than April 30, 2023 without securing further City Council approval, and to report back in Q1 2023.
- Report seeks authorities to:
 - Extend the majority of sites through April 30, 2024.
 - Implement various refugee response planning measures

Decommissioning up to 5 sites in 2023

- The majority of sites are either already contracted to extend past April 2023 or we have requested the authority to extend them through the staff report
- Up to 5 locations will be closed in 2023 based on negotiations with hotel owners. These locations are part of a confidential attachment.
- Based on information currently available, we have begun planning with operators to support residents of sites that may not be able to operate past April 2023

Additional sites are being monitored, and we are subject to Council's approval of the staff report

Supporting Decommissioning Sites

- When a site is closing, the City and its operators work with the clients affected to develop an individual relocation plan that may include a move to housing or another shelter.
- SSHA has supported clients with the obtaining the documentation required for securing housing, through ID clinics, tax clinics, income supports and housing application supports.
- Training and supports have also been made available to housing workers to help expedite access to housing.
- 90 days is recommended to provide the time necessary to support successful transitions to housing for as many people as possible. This allows for the time required to procure and upload essential documents, match and refer people to housing, sign leases, secure furniture, and move into units.
- Throughout temporary shelter site transitions to date, it is clear that the success of the transition plan is dependent on availability of affordable and supportive housing opportunities for people experiencing homelessness.
