

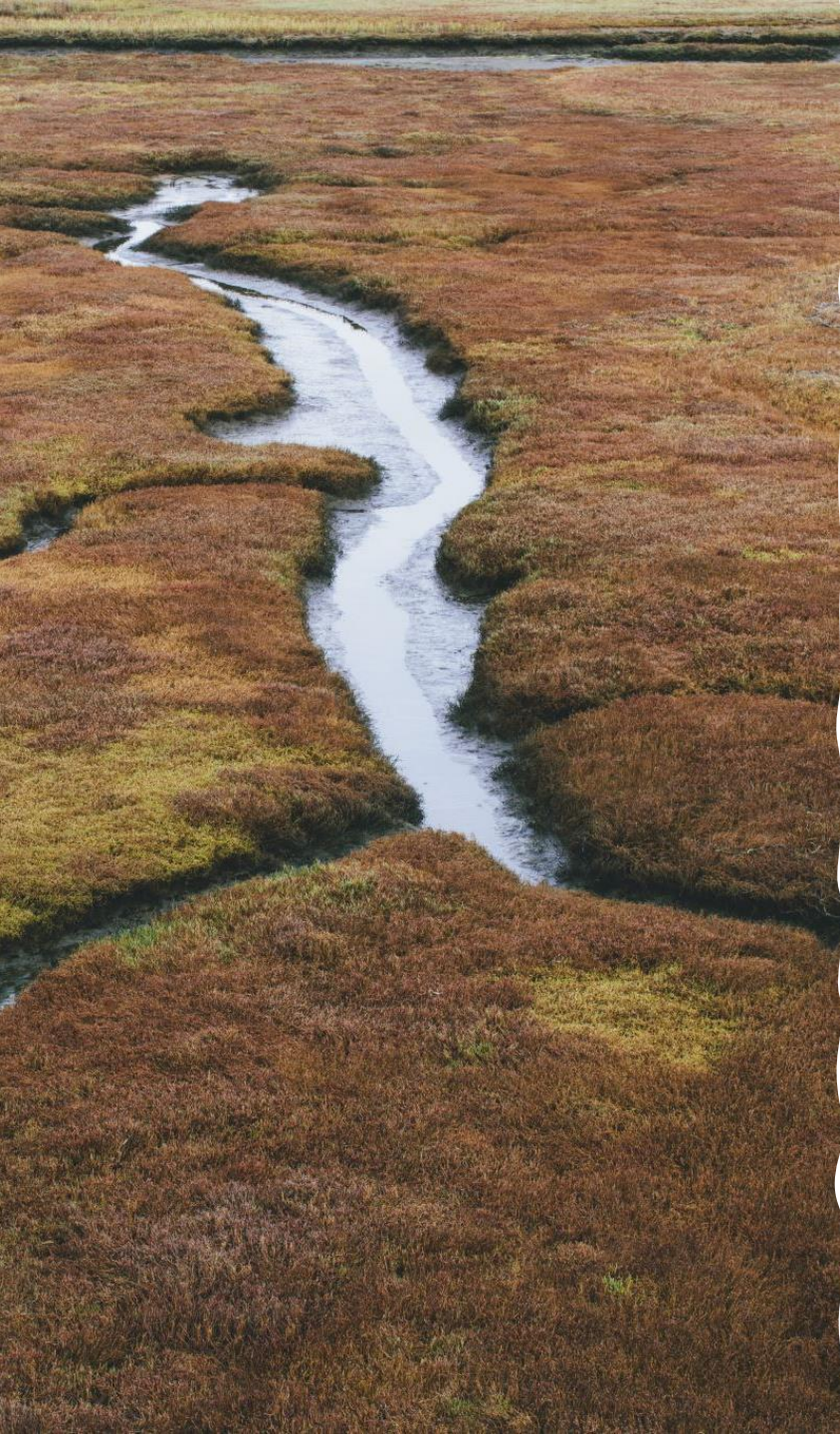

- Mayoral Pledge
 - Developing a Toronto Plan to End Homelessness
 - In place by fall 2023 to prepare for next City budget
 - Increased housing outcomes every month – set to create more outflow than inflow
 - Mayor’s Roundtable to develop this plan in collaboration with community and people with lived experience
- Dedicated Fund to address homelessness
 - New revenue source – Potential use of the Vacant Home Tax
 - Adequate funding for City divisions and community service providers
