



Gender breakdown for Youth population




6.3% of Youth self-identify as Transgender, Non-Binary, Two-Spirit compared to **1.2%** for the non-Youth population for the same time period

Proportion Indigenous and refugee within the Youth population, N=1112




Compared to:

- 17.8% Refugee in the non-Youth population




Chronic homelessness has increased for adult age categories, but not children and youth





Returned from Housing vs. Moved to Housing







Estimating returns to shelter from permanent housing for Youth




23 youth returned to shelter between April 2020 and December 2021. Return rate of 18.1%

The median time to return to shelter was **188 days**
